## The Future of Long-Term Care in Europe: Challenges and Policy - Policy Roundtable -

A significant share of elderly citizens in many European countries are facing unmet care needs today. At the same time, the demand for long-term care in the EU is only set to increase in the near future due to demographic trends, notably the large baby boomer generation growing older. It is paramount for EU policy makers to prepare the region for this incoming care wave.

The BB-Future research project (full title: The Care Wave and the Future of the Baby Boomers and their Children) aims to understand the size and the implications of the care wave on economic and social outcomes and to develop policy recommendations for advance planning.

At this first policy roundtable, we will present the initial results from the project as well as discuss ongoing policy efforts related to long-term care with stakeholders from the long-term care policy sphere. These discussions will directly help orient the future direction of the project.
