The overarching theme of this strategic session is how do we turn our work so far into realistic policy simulations:

How well are models calibrated so far? What do we need for a more scientific estimation? What are the policy relevant targets?

How do the two micro models compare? What is needed for decide which model fits better? Can we identify country variation?

How sensitive are micro models w.r.t. macro model outcomes such as wages and interest rate?

How sensitive is macro model w.r.t. micro model outcomes such as LTC demand and supply?

How do we model two labor market segments (care/non-care) in the macro model elegantly without endogenizing care supply on the macro level (hair dresser and migration analogues)?

Do the models have the details necessary to implement the policy scenarios to be supplied by Bruegel?

How do we handle changes in health (progress or decline, prevention) in a consistent fashion across WPs?
